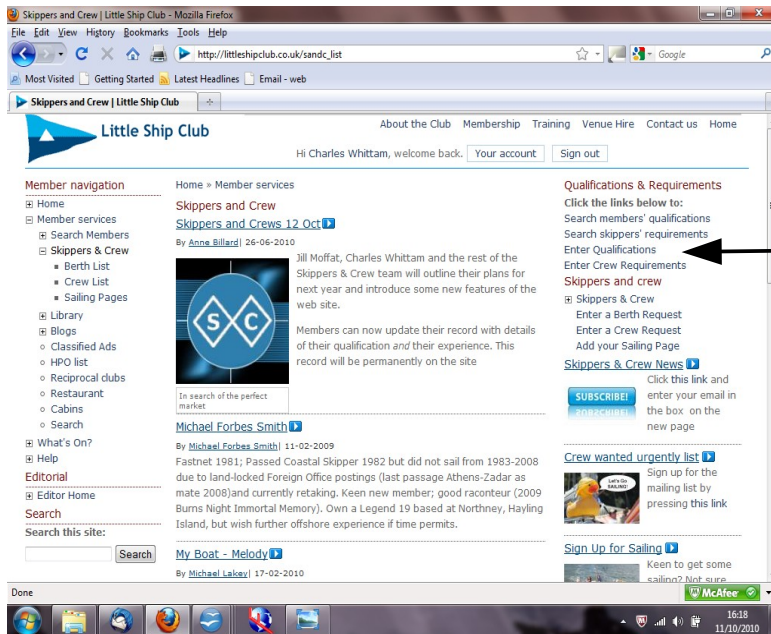


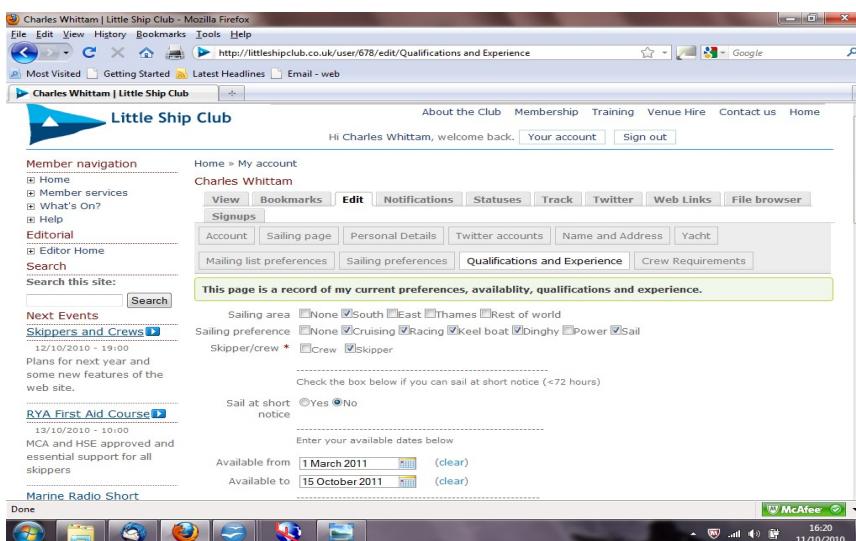


How to enter your qualifications and experience

- Log into the members area of the website
- Click on Member Services, followed by Skippers and Crew
 - this will bring you to the page shown below
- Then click on the Enter Qualifications link on the top RH side of the page

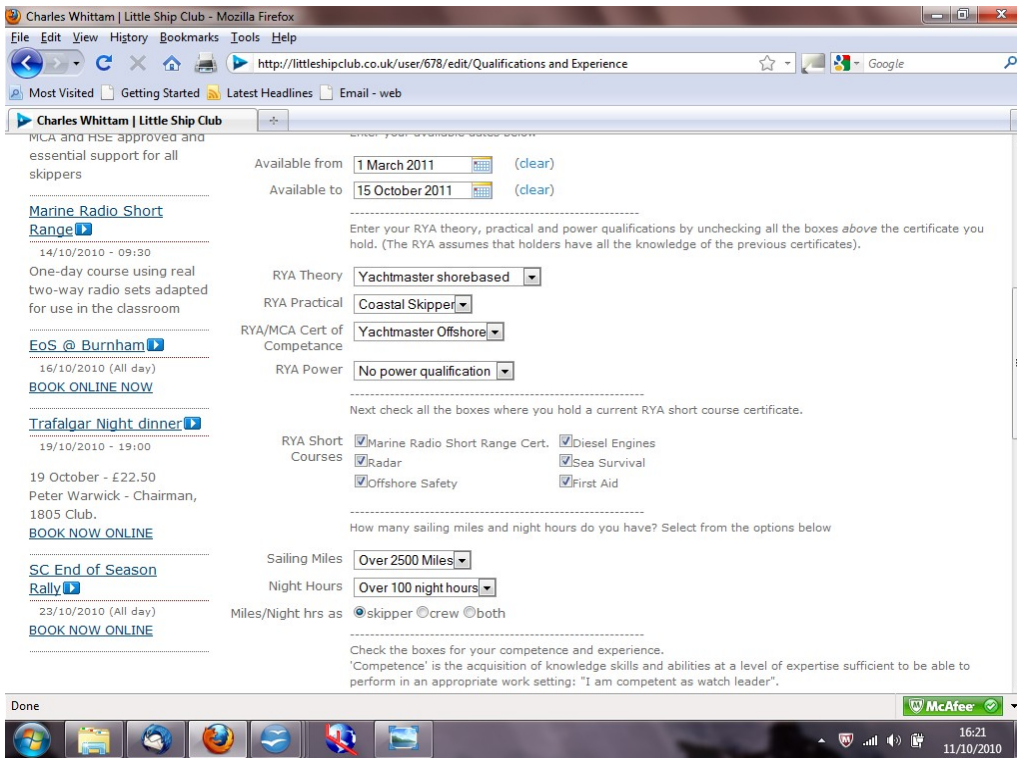


- This will bring you to the entry screen where you can permanently record your training and experience and general availability – you can always go back and edit or add to the details at any time, but you will not have to re-enter the information each time you complete a berth or crew request, and it will form part of your personal profile page
- This is the top part of the screen:

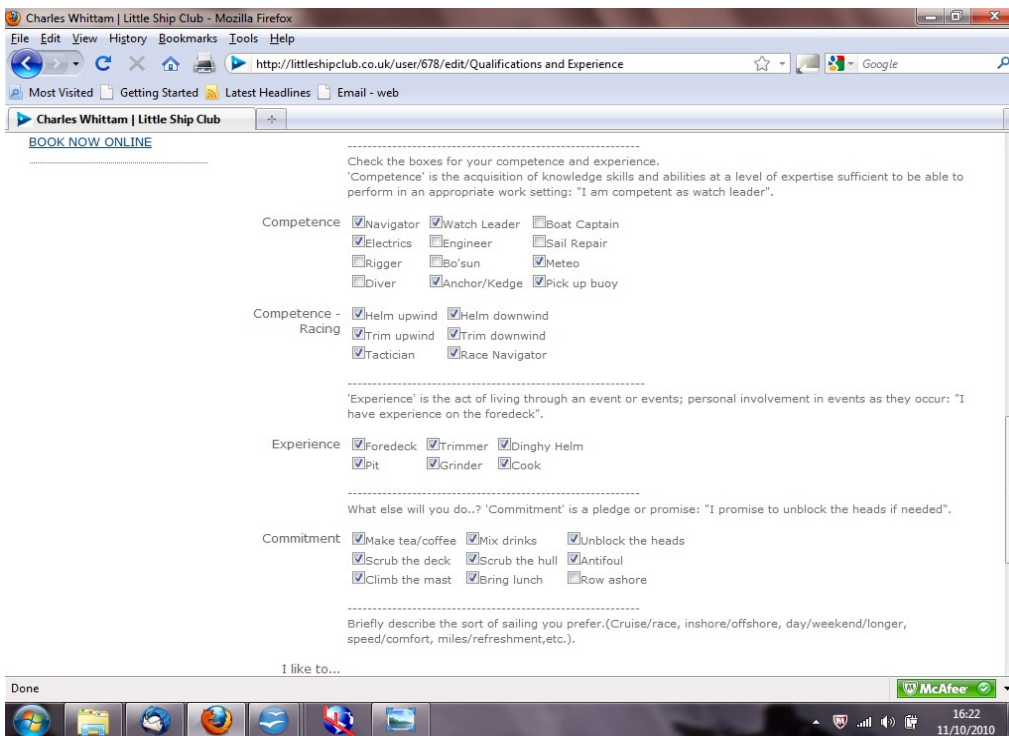


- You complete your details principally either by selecting choices from the drop down boxes or clicking on radio buttons or check boxes

- This is the next part of the screen where you can enter your theory and practical qualifications as well as any of the RYA/MCA certificates of competence held

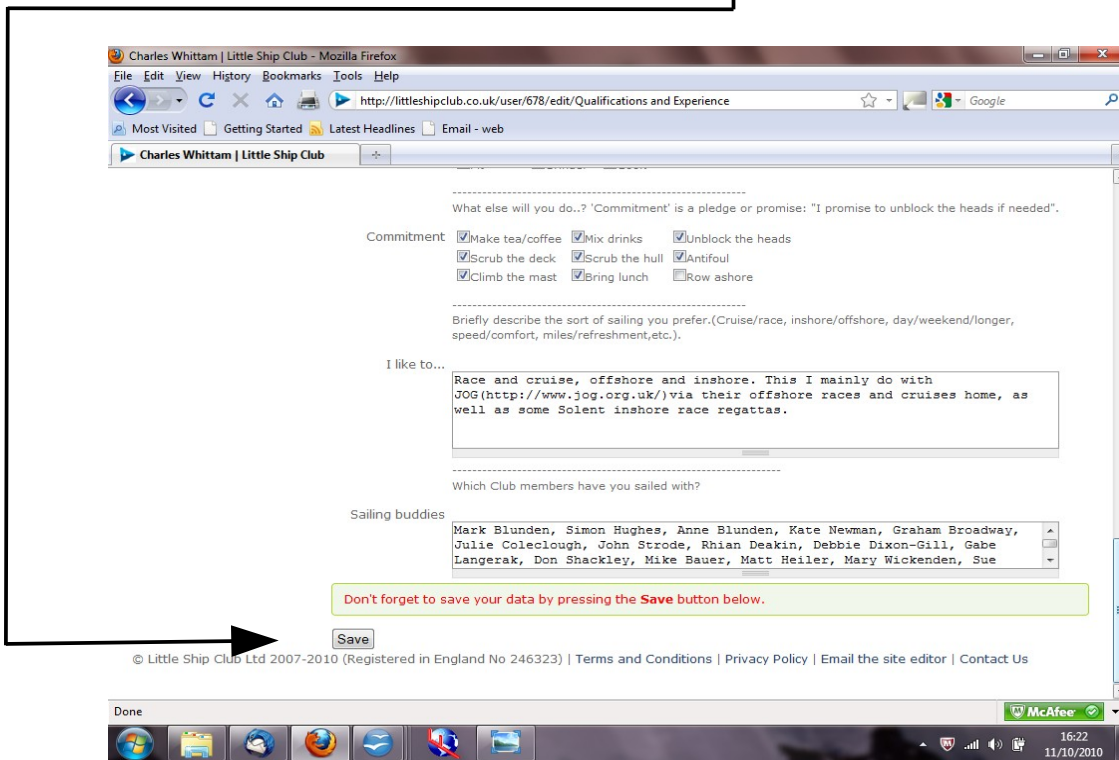


- This is the next section where you can list your detailed competencies and experience

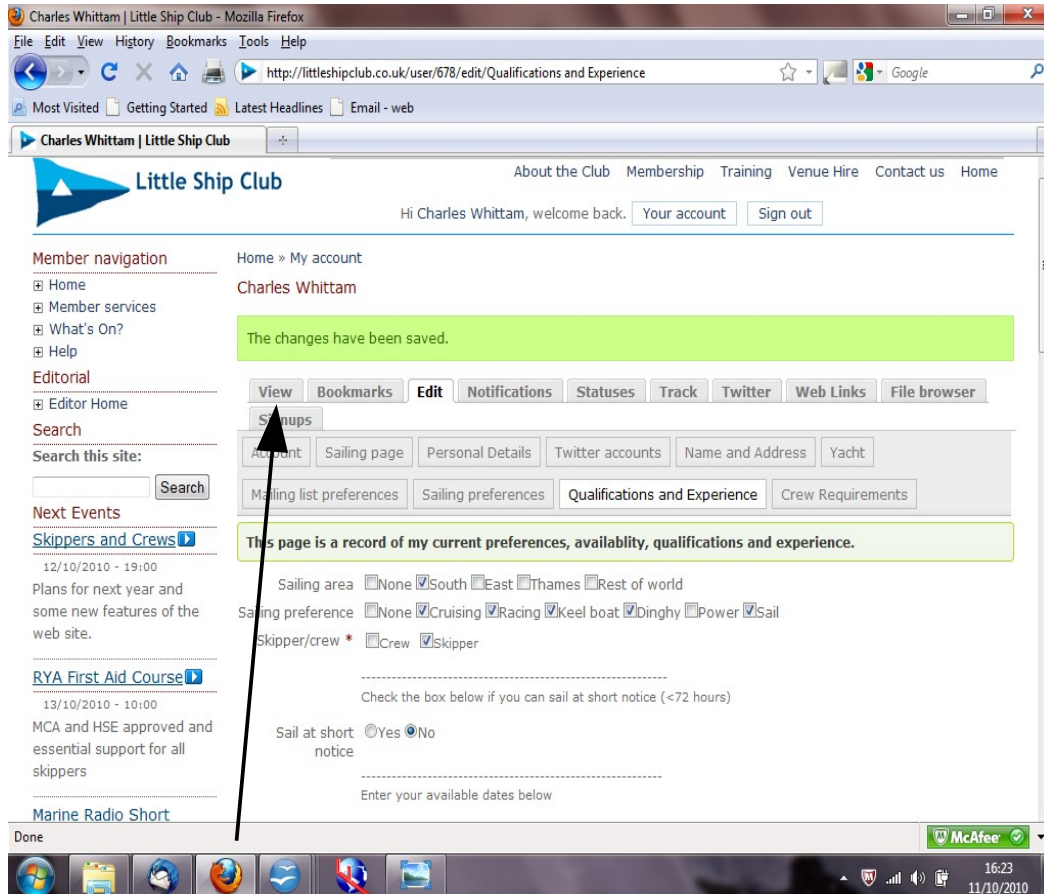


- Finally you have some space to say what supportive commitments you will make, type of sailing you like to do and, if you like, you can name any LSC members with whom you have sailed

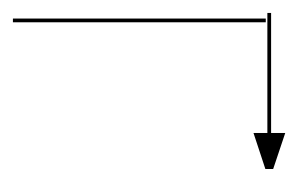
- When you have finished don't forget to press the **SAVE** button
